Through all the years it was a tradition that the Event booklet would start with a message from Leonard.


While he is still with us in spirit – always –, I was a bit sad not being able to post his message. But then I remembered something.

Dear Friends,

Welcome to Budapest and the 11th International Leonard Cohen Event!

Since our first gathering, in Lincoln, UK, 20 years ago, Leonard Cohen's music and poetry have taken a growing number of us to a round-trip to different locales around the world. During these two decades, we have enjoyed the remarkable hospitality of our local Event teams in Montreal, Hydra, New York, Berlin, Edmonton, Krakow, Madison (WI), Dublin, and – two years ago – in Amsterdam. In two years, we will have a reunion in Ghent, Belgium – a city that hosted no fewer than eight concerts during Leonard's Grand Tour.

From Amsterdam to Budapest

Not long after our last official gathering, in the Netherlands, we sadly lost Our Man in November 2016. Leonard's death was a shock to all of us; we knew it would happen one day, but it still hit us like a bolt of lightning.

In spite of his deteriorating health, Leonard worked hard to the very last moments of his life. He had created and recorded several new songs for another album, and had just completed his new collection of poetry. *The Flame* will be published in several languages in October 2018. With many thanks to Robert Kory, Leonard's longtime manager and friend, we are privileged to print, in this booklet, some original pages from *The Flame*. These previews were selected by Alexandra Pleshoyano, professor at Sherbrooke University, Cohen scholar, and editor of *The Flame*.

In June 2017, more than 200 members of the Leonard Cohen Forum traveled to the Greek island of Hydra. Our 8th Hydra meetup was very special: we were finally able to inaugurate the stone bench dedicated to Leonard's memory.

Thanks to our very successful campaign, we had a bonus of extra funds, which were donated to the Social Supermarket and Social Pharmacy of Hydra. These charity projects are operated by the Municipality of Hydra. Our money will be used to buy food and medicines for local people with urgent needs. There are many - often, elderly - people, who have no income at all and no younger generations to support them.

Many of us have fallen in love with Hydra and want to return to enjoy the Mediterranean beauty of the island. Our biennial meetups will continue, and the next time we take over the island will be June 2019. Details will be posted this fall.

Last November, one year after Leonard's death, about 200 Cohenites traveled to Montreal, to participate in the memorial week. There were many highlights: the awesome tribute concert *Tower of Song* was presented by the Leonard Cohen Family; *A Crack in Everything*, the Exhibition of Art Inspired by Leonard Cohen at the MAC, the Musée d'art contemporain de Montreal; and two Leonard Cohen murals, gracefully dominating one side of two separate, multi-storied buildings. Our local team had organized a guided city tour, and a dinner at Moishe's, one of Leonard's favourite restaurants. We also had the chance to engage in private, sentimental farewells at Leonard's grave in Congregation ShaarHashomayim.

There is also a third series of happenings organized by our active members: the Walking Weekends. Last year, approximately 50 of us met in Badacsony at the Balaton Lake in Hungary. In previous years, we have had similar weekend gatherings in Barmouth (UK), Haiger (Germany), Galway (Ireland), and Viladrau (Spain). Plans for the next one, in the UK during the fall of 2019, will be revealed at the end of this year.

Leonard's blessings





The VENUE

Budapest Jazz Club opened in 2008, and moved to its current place (which used to be a cinema) in 2012. It has an exceptional sound quality, a friendly jazz café and bistro-style restaurant. Their guests can enjoy the sounds of a Yamaha piano in the Club, and a Blüthner piano in the café.

The club brings the world famous stars of club-life, as well as well-known faces of national and international jazz. One of their aims is to support the birth of performances in different styles with keeping the concept of jazz as the symbol of high standards in mind.

The Budapest Jazz Club supports young talents, hosts professional events of local jazz life but above all provides a scene that serves the needs of those looking for quality entertainment.



Mariann Falusi & Péter Sárik Trio ft. Fegyva Jávori

Mariann was born in 1959 in a little town named Barcs in South-Western Hungary. From 1979 to 1983 she studied at the Liszt Ferenc College of Music.

In 1983 she won the biggest talent show of Hungary of that era in the jazz category. From 1983 to 1985 she was the soloist of Stúdium Dixieland Band. From 1985 to 1988 she played several roles in theatre and acted in Hungarian movies.

Since 1988 she has been a member of the PA-DÖ-DŐ pop music duo, with her partner Györgyi Lang. She was a member of the jury panel for talents shows like Hungarian Rising Star or Megasztár.

In 2011 she had a concert at Summer Jewish Festival singing Leonard Cohen and Irving Berlin songs. For the Event she arranged a new show with her long time collaborator Péter Sárik and invited Ferenc Jávori, leader of Budapest Klezmer Band as a guest star.



Sabbathsong Klezmer Band

The twenty-year-old-band is comprised mainly of artists of famous classical orchestras (e.g. the Orchestra of the Hungarian Opera House, the Honvéd Musical Group, etc.).

They regularly participate in yearly Jewish Summer Festivals and in events related to the anniversary of the foundation of the Jewish State, as well as in different anti-racism events. They have performed in the Vigadó (with the well-known poet András Mezei), at the Buda Stage („Klezmer and literature” performance), and in the Herzl-tér Street Festival. They take part in important cultural events (opening ceremonies, Jewish Cultural Days, wedding ceremonies) in various parts of the country.

Their first album was released in 2000, thanks to the kind initiative of Mr. Tamás Raj Chief Rabbi, who organized an event at the Makkabi Book and Music Publishing House for the occasion. Apart from East European Klezmer music, their repertoire features both traditional and modern Yiddish and Israeli songs and dances.

Besides performing Jewish music professionally, their aim is to rediscover the spiritual roots of the music, as well as the background of the songs, i.e. the Biblical truth. Hence their slogan: „More than Klezmer.”



Janerik Lundqvist

Many participants are familiar with Swedish singer Janerik Lundqvist. After a long break, he is back again to give us another unforgettable experience. In 2016 his album "Den 3dje Leonard Cohen på svenska (The 3rd Leonard Cohen in Swedish) was nominated to 'The German Record Critics' Award.

A long lean man in black with a low rumble of a voice is singing Take This Waltz as Leonard Cohen himself would sing it, only in Swedish.

Jánosy Trio

WHO ARE THEY

An eclectic band unified by a common passion for musical excellence. Comprised of Kinga Madaras (keyboard and vocals), László Zsikai (double bass), and Márton Jánosy (guitar and vocals), the trio performs covers of folk songs blended with elements of jazz. László and Márton had played together in several other projects beginning in 2014, before Kinga joined them this year. Together, they have found a new tone and a new ambition to create unique arrangements of the works of various folksingers.

WHERE DO THEY COME FROM

The members' musical influences range from soul and acoustic pop to Hungarian folk and even classical music, which is hardly surprising given that Kinga and Márton share an extensive background in classical education thanks to the legacy of the prominent Hungarian composer and educator, Zoltán Kodály, whose famous quote, "a good folk song is a perfect masterpiece in itself", is an insight very relevant to an event dedicated to another prominent figure of a very different kind of folk music, Leonard Cohen.

The band is honoured by the invitation to perform in the 2018 Leonard Cohen Event in Budapest. Having the chance to celebrate with Cohenites from all over the world provides a unique opportunity to play the master's songs to a truly dedicated audience. Although the debut of the young singer-songwriter was only a year ago with a few Leonard Cohen songs at Ördögkatlan Festival, she's determined to follow through with her unique dialogue built between songs and performer. Together with respected pianist Boris Yakshov and in one case with singer Tomi Széll, a fresh, playful, but still intimate concert comes to life. While staying focused on Cohen's songs, other interesting artists' works will help give a broader understanding of his world.

Mallory Chipman

Hailing from Edmonton, Canada, awarding-winning jazz singer and composer, Mallory Chipman is thrilled to be back at the International Leonard Cohen Event, this time in beautiful Budapest. While Mallory has been a Leonard Cohen fan since she first heard her favourite “So Long, Marianne” when she was only a child, it was her experiences at the Leonard Cohen Events that motivated her to create an album in his honour - Rags and Feathers: A Tribute to Leonard Cohen - which was released in October 2017 on Bent River Records. Rags and Feathers features seven Cohen compositions arranged in Mallory’s modern jazz style, complimented by two original songs inspired by the life and legacy of Leonard Cohen. One of her original pieces on the record, “Tune for the Troubadour”, received a nomination for Jazz Recording of the Year at the 2018 Edmonton Music Awards, and her album is receiving radio play across the globe. Mallory is joined by her long time collaborator, guitar player, and fiancé, Brett Hansen.



The Gresham Palace

The Arena concert in 2009 was the only time Leonard has been to Budapest. The hotel he stayed at was Four Seasons Hotel Gresham Palace.

The Gresham Palace is a great example of Art Nouveau architecture, a landmark on the scenic Danube bank. Its construction was completed in 1906 for the London-based Gresham Life Assurance Company as a foreign headquarters.

With the siege of Budapest during World War II, Gresham Palace was badly damaged. After the war the building was used for various purposes (like barracks for the Soviet Army or later as an apartment building) but fell into a state of major disrepair. So much so it was almost lost. After extensive renovation, it reopened as a luxury hotel in June 2004. The beautiful Art Nouveau lobby is definitely worth a visit.

Sirona was built in 1980 West-Germany. In the early 2000s, the boat has been rebuilt to make dinner cruises on the Sava River.


Long-ago, the cabin passenger vessel in our days has a closed lower hall, a walk-around center hall, and an opened terrace. The lower hall has bright colors, Bamboo parquet floor, intimate lightning technical equipment, central heating and air-condition system. In the middle hall, the cover is darker and it has panoramic windows all over the hall to get a clear view for Budapest. The opened terrace has a top but the view from here is tower above all of your imagination.

All three decks has a good quality speaker system and central CD player to make our guests feel more comfortable during the cruise.

Total length: 43.5 metres Maximum capacity: 250 person





Leonard's 1974 concert at Brighton, England:

To the roar of applause, Leonard walked out onto the stage. He was much smaller than I had imagined, but had a charisma that filled the entire theatre.

With a nylon-stringed guitar strapped to his body, he stood in front of the microphone, about a meter from where I was sitting, arms hanging loosely by his side. He wore an immaculate grey suit with tie, and with little expression on his face - just standing quietly until the applause died down.

We thought he might say something, maybe start singing, but he just stood there silently like a statue. One could hear a pin drop. It was comical, because he looked sort of lost, almost frightened.

I couldn't help but laugh a little bit, at which point he looked slowly down, and in mock anger held onto the microphone with one hand and said: "What's so funny, what's so damned funny!" the audience now both laughed and clapped, and that sort of broke the ice, creating the warm humoristic atmosphere for which he is known. Then he demonstratively raised his nose, started sniffing the air - these were days before smoking was banned from theatres. "Are you burning rubber down there?" - he asked, implying that someone was smoking marijuana. Guffaws of laughter from the audience; a real comedy act. He then put his fingers to the guitar and picked the opening bars to 'Bird On The Wire'.

The show began, and so did a relationship with Leonard that lasted many years.




The Absent Mare by Geoffrey Wren 2016


